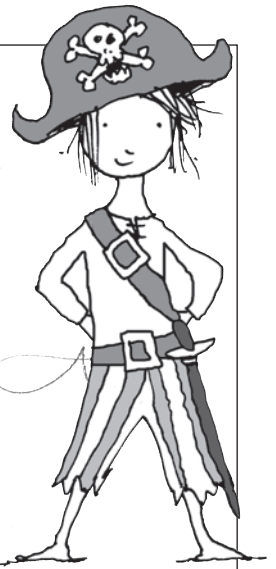


# How to draw a VIKING SHIP

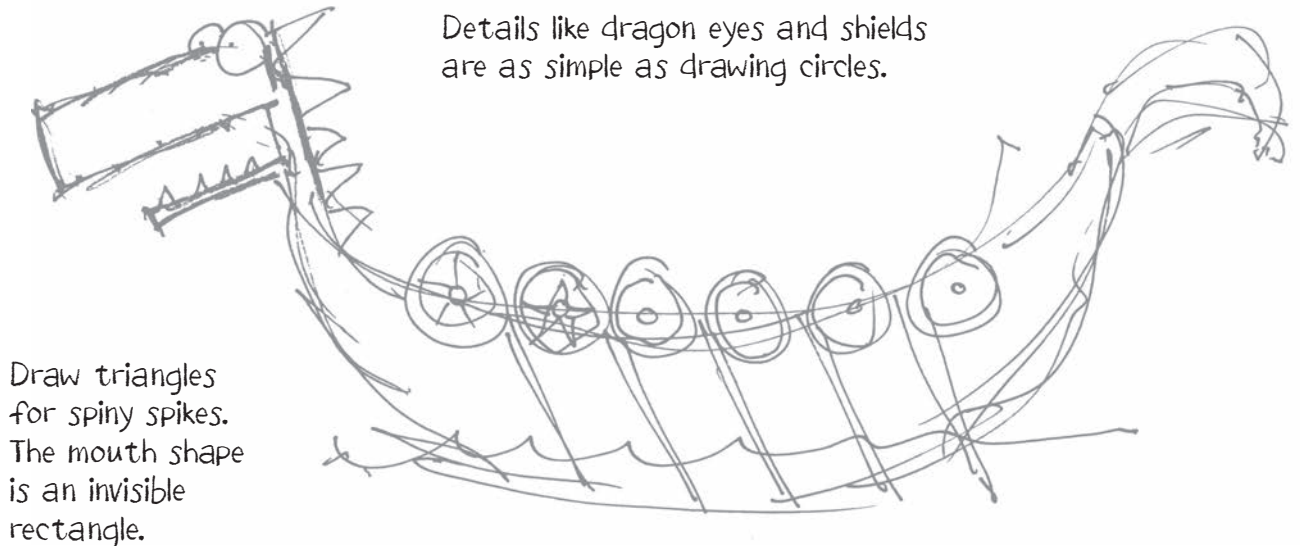
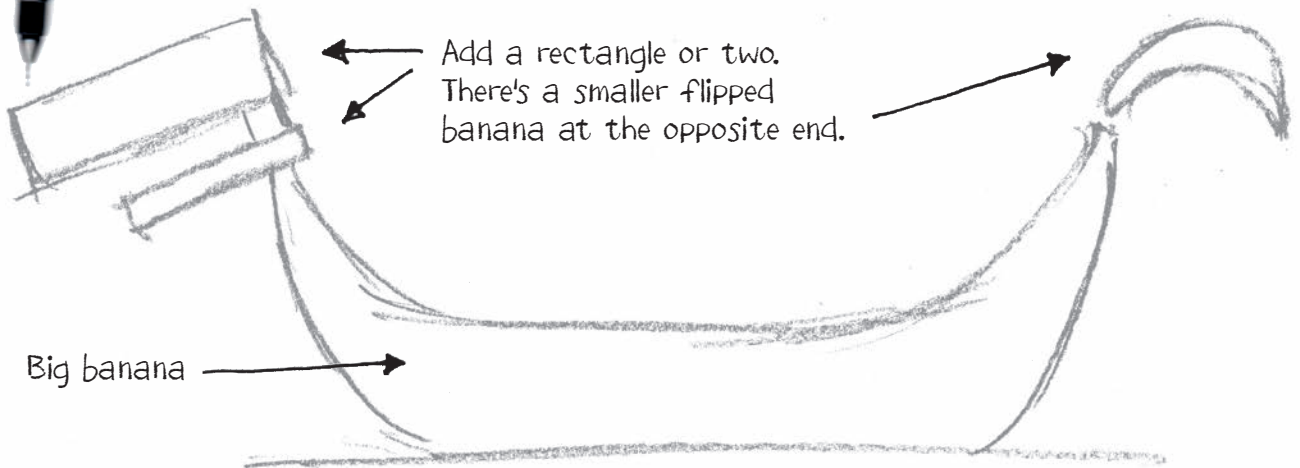


## WHAT YOU NEED

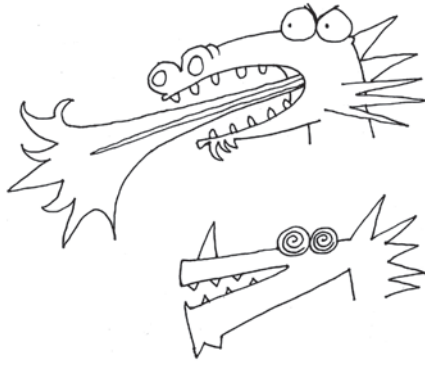
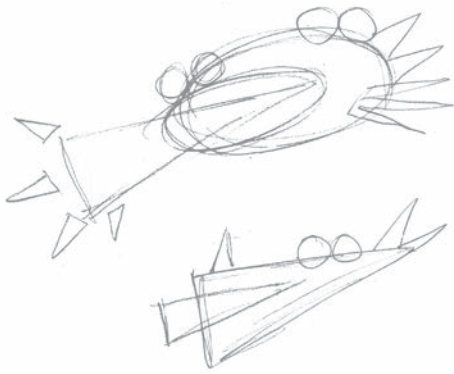
- ☠️ 2b (or similar) pencil.
- ☠️ Black (felt tip) pen.
- ☠️ A scribbly mind.

Think of a Viking ship as a hand-crafted object. There's no right or wrong. Each ship is unique. Use your pencil to begin sketching scribbly and freely. Think of easy shapes that you can start with e.g. circles, rectangles, ovals or anything else you can think of.

I'm starting with a big banana for the hull of the ship.



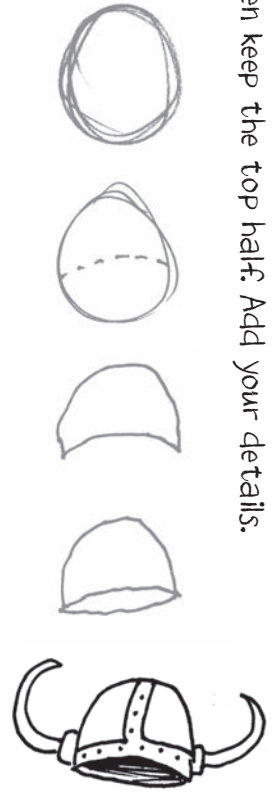
Draw triangles for spiny spikes. The mouth shape is an invisible rectangle.



Dragon heads can be as creative, realistic, abstract or cartoony as you wish. Play with your pencil and pen until you're in your happy place.





Your Viking crew are mostly made of scribbly circles and half circles with more scribble everywhere else. Add woolly clothes, plaits, weapons and other Viking stuff.

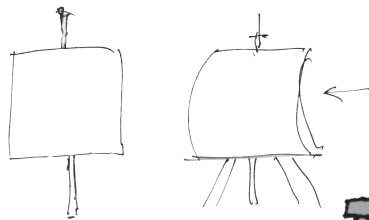


Helmets start as ovals. Divide in two then keep the top half. Add your details.

## TO FINISH

 Place a new piece of paper over your scribbly drawing.

 Trace through using your black pen for a clean, finished and ready for action



The sail is a square on a stick. Depending on which way your ship's travelling, imagine the wind bending the vertical lines left or right. Add stay ropes so that it doesn't fall down in a big storm. Decorate.

## VIKING SHIP

Fill the shields' middle circles with any pattern you like e.g. wooden boards or stars.
